

Reflexive verbs are used [↳] **REFLEXIVE VERBS ~ CAPÍTULO 2A**
 when a person does an action to themselves.

These are still verbs. Like we already know, you have to conjugate most of the time

REGULAR VERBS:

REFLEXIVE PRONOUNS

me	nos
te	os
se	se

These tell us who the action is done to.

- 1) afeitarse: to shave (oneself)
- 2) maquillarse: _____
- 3) peinarse: to comb (one's) hair
- 4) secarse: _____
- 5) levantarse: to get (oneself) up
- 6) arreglarse: _____
- 7) bañarse: to bathe (oneself)
- 8) cepillarse: _____
- 9) ducharse: to shower (oneself)
- 10) lavarse: _____

the "se" attached to the end is telling you this is reflexive and you should use reflexive pronouns

I shave: Me afeito

You put on make up: Te maquillas

They brush their teeth: Se cepillan Los dientes

We comb our hair: Nos peinamos el pelo

With reflexive action you don't use a possessive adj- like you would in English

CONJUGATE 2 REGULAR VERBS

me lavo	nos lavamos
te lavas	os laváis
se lava	se lavan

me seco	nos secamos
te secas	os secáis
se seca	se secan

IRREGULAR & STEM-CHANGING VERBS



- 11) despertarse (ie): to wake (oneself) up
- 12) acostarse (ue): to go to bed / lie down
- 13) dormirse (ue): to fall asleep
- 14) ponerse (*go): to put on (to yourself)

you have to remember that some verbs are irregular when you conjugate.

We go to sleep: Nos acostamos

She wakes up: Se despierta

I put on clothes: Me pongo

CONJUGATE 2 IRREGULAR VERBS

me pongo	nos ponemos
te pones	os ponéis
se pone	se ponen

me visto	nos vestimos
te vistes	os vestís
se viste	se visten

REFLEXIVE PRONOUNS (RP)

Me	nos
te	os
se	se

Always before conjugated verb

Formula 1: **RP** + **conjugated verb**

*Formula 2: **Conjugated verb** + **infinitive verb** + **RP**

attached.

*Only if there are 2 verbs

↳ This is an option for when there are 2 verbs, not a requirement most of the time.

EJEMPLOS:

I need to shower. → Me necesito duchar.

*You prefer to comb your hair. → *Prefieres peinarte.

Práctica:

1. **You put on makeup** in the mornings.

Tú **te maquillas** en las mañanas.

2. Later, **he showers** at night.

Luego él **se ducha** en la noche.

3. After, **they brush their teeth** with a toothbrush.

Después **se cepillan** los dientes con un cepillo de dientes

4. Finally **we go to bed** at 10:00 pm.

Finalmente **nos acostamos** a las 10 de la noche.

5. **I wake up** at 6:00 and turn on the lights.

yo **me despierto** a las 6:00 y enciendo las luces.

Use Formula 2 for 6-10:

6. You prefer **to bathe yourself** in the night.

Tú **prefieres bañarte** en la noche.

7. I like **to dry** my hair with a towel.

~~yo~~ **me gusta secarme** con una toalla.

8. We want **to get dressed** before we leave.

Nosotros **queremos vestirnos** antes de salir.

9. They decide **to get ready** for the party.

Ellos **deciden prepararse** para la fiesta.

10. She has **to put on makeup** in the morning.

Ella **tiene que maquillarse** en la mañana
